Overview

Starting from 31st March 2025, new legislation in England will require businesses with more than 10 fulltime employees to separate "recycling relevant waste" before collection for off-site processing. IMPACT ON YOUR BUSINESS

Under the new legislation, businesses must:

- Separate dry recyclables, food waste, and general waste
- Ensure that the waste collected on and transported from their premises is correctly segregated

N.B. Dry recyclables can be grouped together





Prohibited Practices

Businesses will no longer be allowed to use food waste disposal equipment (e.g., dewatering or enzyme digesters) to discharge food waste or liquid derived from food waste into drains or sewers.
